

TV – Operation

Turning on the TV:

- 1. Please ensure that the DVD-player is turned off.
- 2. Take the LG remote control and click on power (the button in the upper middle). An optional TV-channel will then appear. You can then choose among optional channels from 4 to XXX (1-3 do not work) with the small gray SAT-remote control. The channel selection will appear on the SAT-control that is the small device directly underneath the screen. A desired channel will appear if you click the right numbers (for example, 2 and 4 for channel 24).
- 3. If after pushing the power button on the LG remote control, no channel appears, take the (small gray) SAT- control and click on the red power button on the upper left. A channel will then appear, and you may optionally continue (as described in point 2 above). That power button engages the SAT-receiver.
- 4. Please ensure that the red picto-gram with "Alle Programme" appears on the green baseboard (it always appears when you select a new channel). If that is not the case, click the button FAV on the small remote control until the picto-gram "Alle Programme" appears on the baseboard.
- 5. When you watch TV, you need only the small remote control, both for channel selection and for volume.
- 6. When you want to turn the TV off, simply click the power button on the large LG-remote control (upper middle).
- 7. If you turn on the DVD player during a TV program, you will automatically be in a DVD program. That means that you can watch TV only when the DVD player (the device on the left beneath the screen) is turned off.

Turning on the DVD player:

- 1. Please ensure that the TV is turned off. You can turn it off by using the red power button on the small gray remote control.
- 2. Turn on the DVD player, either directly or by using the black Denon remote control.
- 3. Put in a DVD and activate the device. You may then choose among the alternatives. Control the volume with the LG remote control.
- 4. If you hear noise or music that does not come from the DVD, a TV program is going on behind the DVD. To end the TV program, click the red power button on the upper left of the small SAT-remote control.
- 5. When you want to end the DVD transmission, click the off button on the upper left of the DENON remote control and remove the DVD (the upper right button).
- 6. You can turn off the TV with the power button (upper middle).

Handbooks and other instructions for the devices and the remote controls are behind the TV in the library.



2. Internet Access

<u>Starting:</u> An iMac for computer work and internet access is available on the first floor. The device can be activated by using the power button on its lower right side. The Mac starts to operate very quickly. The appropriate symbols appear on the desktop (for example, Explorer/Safari for internet access). A more-extensive work symbol list will appear if you move the mouse all the way down (baseboard).

<u>Turning it off:</u> You can turn off the device by clicking on the Apple symbol (upper left on the desktop) and then click "turn-off" on the lower bar.

Your own devices – Wireless or with cable

If you have a laptop and want to access the internet, you can use a patch-cable on the ground floor and on the first floor. There is an airport station behind the TV screen on the ground floor that will enable you to access the internet in wireless fashion. What do you have to do:

- 1. Click on the lower right part of your screen "screen with waves". If there is no connection to the internet, you will be asked to right-click on your mouse to obtain additional options.
- 2. The window "wireless network connections" will then appear with information about the "Napoleon network". Then simply click on connections and input the network key.
- 3. The network key for wireless cards third provider 40 bit is: **3F14D992FE** (you must enter it twice and then once again to confirm).

3. Radio and CD Player

In the sitting room on the ground floor, there is a sideboard with a Thomson stereo tower to the left behind the entrance door that you can use to play CDs or cassettes (up to 5 items in the disk changer) or to listen to the radio. The remote control is on the tower. All available radio stations such as Ö3, Radio Carinthia, Ö1 and Antenne etc., are programmed.

Channel selection may be made by using DIGITAL TUNING with the button >> (forward) or << (back). To change to CD or TAPE, use the button "source."

Use the rotary knob to control the volume. The music will be transmitted to the sitting room, the bedroom, the loggia and the bathroom. You can increase or decrease the volume of the music or turn it off in all rooms. Only in the children's rooms there is no music.

You can regulate the volume of the music on the ground floor by using the touchscreen in the kitchen (right next to the entrance door). But, it would be better to regulate the volume in each individual room. There is also a stereo device (Denon) on the sideboard on the first floor. You can turn the music on and off there. Two high-value speakers provide exclusive musical enjoyment.



4. Touchscreens

Light and sound control

There are so-called <u>touchscreens</u> both on the ground floor (next to the entrance door to the kitchen) and on the first floor (installed in the commode next to the top of the stairs) that will enable you to regulate sources of electricity, light and sound in the house.

Arrows give you instructions about how to proceed. An arrow pointing left means "get out of the menu," an arrow pointing down means "continue," and an arrow pointing up means "go back" within the menu.

On the "<u>light menu</u>" an entirely-black bulb means fully engaged, a half-lit bulb means "dimmed," and an empty bulb means "turned off." The source of the light may be read under the bulb. There, where there is a – on the left next to the bulb and a + on the right next to the bulb, you can increase or decrease the light.

The same thing applies to the sound/loud-speaker sources in the "music menu". The more waves next to the loud-speaker, the louder the sound will be. It is possible to turn them on and off here. Under the respective sound source, there is identification of the room to which it applies.

5. Washing machine, dryer and ironing machine

They are at your disposal in the basement. If you are unable to use them properly, please call Mrs. Hermine at telephone number 04734-724 or thoroughly read the instructions (they are in the drawer under the radio tower in the sitting room on the ground floor).

6. Heating and warm water

The house technology is located in the basement.

The house is heated with geothermal energy. If too little energy is available, water can be warmed with electricity. If the temperature is unsatisfactory, please inform Mrs. Hermine (Tel.: 04734/724) but do not try to solve the problem yourself! Entrance to the heating room is not permitted.

7. Electricity supply

Internet reception and electricity controls are in the basement (wash-room). If electricity is lost owing to excessive demand or a "short", the fuse box is accessible. If another problem occurs, please inform house electrician Ingo Griesser: Tel. 0664-5429157.



8. Stove and chimney

An electric stove with four burners and a wood stove are at your disposal in the kitchen and may be used for cooking, and the tile stove behind them can be used for heating. Dry, cut wood and kindling are in the carport. For more-rapid combustion, anhydrous ethyl alcohol under the sink may be used. If you have problems, please notify Mrs. Hermine immediately. It is quite simple, but please avoid experiments.

9. Rubbish separation

A rubbish container and a paper container are at your disposal in the carport. Please use the available rubbish bags for disposal of ordinary rubbish (food, plastic packaging, cans, etc.) and throw only closed rubbish and paper bags into the rubbish container. Please throw paper, newspapers and packaging material into the paper container without using rubbish bags. Please leave all bottles in the carport (do not throw them into the rubbish container). If you have special rubbish like batteries, metal items and tin cans, please put them into the proper container. The rubbish is picked up every Saturday after house-cleaning.

10. Damages cases

Please report each supposed case of damage or causes of mistakes and problems that occur during your stay. We want to take care of all problems as soon as possible so that future tenants will be able to enjoy their vacation free of care. If you or your children have caused any damage, please be so fair as to report it immediately so that we can deal with it as soon as possible to prevent it from harming a future tenant.

11. Fire-extinguishers

Please make yourself familiar with the use of a fire-extinguisher to enable yourself to react quickly in case of a fire. Our fire-extinguishers (in red) are located on each floor: in the basement (the heating room), on the ground floor between the entrance door and the bedroom and on the the first floor in the large vestibule.
